## Expenditure 2

• <u>Capital Expenditure</u> is spending on items that will last for a number of years

eg.: a car, a house, furniture

• <u>Current Expenditure</u> is spending on day to day items used in the process of living eg.: petrol, light and heat, groceries

• <u>Cash Purchases</u> means we pay for the goods as soon as we get them

<u>Credit Purchases</u> means that we get the goods now and pay for them later - BUY
NOW, PAY LATER!

• <u>Accruals</u> are services that we have the use of now but pay for later **eg**.: telephone, E.S.B.

• <u>An Invoice</u> gives details of amounts owed when goods are bought on credit - *same as a bill*.

• Before paying the amount of an invoice it is important to check to ensure that it is correct.

• <u>A Delivery Note</u> will accompany goods when they are being delivered.

• A buyer signs the delivery note if they are satisfied that the delivery note matches the goods delivered and ordered.
